## **Three Truths:**

- 1. Many want a solution to their problems but don't want to see how they have \_\_\_\_\_\_ to follow in the wrong direction.
- 2. "Direction not \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ determines our destination." ~Andy Stanley
- 3. "We win or lose by the \_\_\_\_\_ we choose."

## Should've Seen That Coming

## **#1. Two Options From Proverbs**

Proverbs 27:12 "The prudent see danger and take refuge, but the simple keep going and suffer for it."

- Two kings of people—both headed down the \_\_\_\_\_ path but have such different results!
- 1. "<u>prudent</u>" A wise person, understands that all of life is \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ so he <u>looks</u> down the <u>road</u> when making <u>decisions</u> and sees <u>consequences</u>.

**Wise Question:** "In light of my past experience, and my \_\_\_\_\_\_ hopes and dreams, what is the wise thing to do?"

Proverbs 27:12 "... but the simple keep going and suffer for it."

- 2. "<u>simple</u>" A naïve person, who lives as though life is disconnected, like there's <u>no connection</u> between today's \_\_\_\_\_\_ and tomorrow's <u>experiences</u>.
- The simple do "see danger" too—but <u>take no evasive action</u> and keep on going.

## Examples:

- \* Eat things you know you'll regret
- \* Every time you \_\_\_\_\_\_ to your spouse

## **#2.** Course Correction

## **Two Realities:**

- 1. The prudent sees danger and <u>act</u> on what they see; the simple see danger but keep on going.
- $\Rightarrow$  Seeing danger but doing nothing—<u>accomplishes nothing</u>.
- 2. The prudent identify behaviors turning into habits—and do something while they can.

## **#3.** The Final Analysis

Proverbs 27:12 "... the simple keep going and suffer for it."

# Why Suffer?

- \* For being <u>oblivious</u> to the <u>obvious</u>
- \* For <u>refusing to act</u> on what they see
- \* For living as if there is no connection between the choices of today and experiences of tomorrow
- \* They overlook the fact that every path has a destination

**What to Expect:** The prudent take refuge, <u>they act</u>, and eventually breathe a <u>sigh of relief</u> instead of a <u>life filled</u> with <u>regrets</u>.
