2 Kings 2:2, 4, 6 - 3x's - Elisha tells Elijah: "As the Lord lives and as you yourself live, I will not leave you."

2 Kings 2:9 "... Elijah said to Elisha, 'Ask what I shall do for you before I am taken from you.' And Elisha said, 'Please let there be a double portion of your spirit on me.'"

2. Don't _____ Until You Are Finished

2 Kings 13:14-20

The Choice: To either open ourselves to God's bigger future or ensure that we make our future smaller than He intends for us.

2 Kings 13:19 *"Then the man of God was angry with him... 'You should have struck five or six times'..."*

Why Did the King Quit? ... tired? ... felt silly? ... was proud? ... felt futile?

The Reality: He quit and the victory was lost; he didn't want it badly enough!

Personal Application:

1. I pray too little, expect too little, do too little.
2. Sometimes—I look for the least I can do; doing only the bare minimum.
3. At Life's End: "I gave everything I had" or "An emptiness—I quit too soon."

The Great Tragedy: To live your life "waiting for" instead of living your life preparing for the moment for God's glory lived and seen thru you.

⇒ Elisha died knowing he Held Nothing Back, the King died knowing he had settled for less than God's Best.

⇒ Allow God to shape your Passions by Loving God with all your heart, mind, and soul.
