James 1:2 "Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds."

Matthew 5:10-12

<u>John 15:19</u>

Three Truths:

1) The <u>persecuted</u> are <u>happy</u> because they are being ______ for heaven.

2) Persecution is one of the natural ______ of being a true Christ-Follower.

<u>1 Peter 5:10</u> "The God of all grace, who has <u>called</u> us into <u>His eternal glory</u> by <u>Christ Jesus</u>, after you have <u>suffered</u> awhile, make you perfect, establish, strengthen, settle you."

Following Christ generates <u>real hostility</u> in our world; <u>Kingdom</u> people are <u>people</u>.

2 Timothy 3:12 "All who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will be persecuted."

<u>1 Thessalonians 3:4</u> "For indeed when we were with you, <u>we kept telling you</u>... that we <u>were going to</u> <u>suffer</u>..."

#1. The ______ of Persecution

<u>Matthew 5:10, 11</u> "<u>Blessed</u> are they which are <u>persecuted for righteousness sake</u>... when men shall <u>revile</u> you and <u>persecute</u> you, and shall <u>say all kinds of evil</u> against you falsely..."

<u>Matthew 5:12</u> "<u>Rejoice</u>, and <u>be glad</u>, for your <u>reward</u> in heaven is great, for so they persecuted the prophets..."

"Be Glad" - literally—to skip and jump with happy excitement, a ______ to trust and obey.

Two Reasons To Rejoice:

1. "Your <u>reward</u> in <u>heaven</u> is <u>great</u>" - whatever we do serving and loving God and therefore loving people—and ______ for <u>Him</u>—<u>reaps eternal rewards</u>.

2. When we suffer for Christ—we are in the best company.

Hebrews 11:36-38

#2. Three Followers of God—_____ For Heaven

1) **Ezekiel**—a prophet sent to suffer, to speak God's word to Israel who refuses to listen to God.

Ezekiel 2:1-8 **Ezekiel will:** eat a scroll, lock himself in his house, be bound with ropes, become a mute, lie on his left side for 390 days...

Ezekiel 3:14, 15 Ezekiel was bitter, enraged, angry and astonished

<u>Romans 8:18</u> "For I consider that the <u>sufferings</u> of this present time are <u>not worth comparing</u> with the glory that is to be <u>revealed</u> to us."

2) <u>Daniel</u>—served Babylon for over 70 years—very faithfully—yet instead of reward—thrown into the lions den: his crime—praying to God.

Daniel 1:8 Daniel resolved that he would not defile himself with the kings food...

Daniel 2:13 "... and they sought Daniel and his companions to kill them."

Daniel 3:18, 19

3) <u>Paul</u>—<u>Philippians 1:12-14</u> "... what has happened to me has really <u>served to advance</u> the gospel... it has <u>become known</u> thru the whole imperial guard... that my imprisonment is for Christ. And most have become confident in the Lord... are much <u>more bold</u> to <u>speak the word without</u> fear."

2 Timothy 4:14-18

The Main Thing: "... so that thru me the message might be fully proclaimed..."
